SHARING THE GOSPEL.

Dear Friend of GBN,

I want to begin by showing you the faces of some of the new Christians you helped to reach over the past year. We could not have accomplished this work or reached these souls without your support. On average, not a week passes that we don't learn of someone being baptized as a result of GBN's efforts. Some weeks, several new Christians are added to the Lord's kingdom.

While every soul is precious, certain stories stand out in our minds. In January, Rickie Oui contacted GBN after watching videos on YouTube. After studying online, Rickie was baptized—becoming the first Christian in his area. Shortly afterward, he converted his wife. In May, four more souls obeyed the gospel, and today there is a faithful, thriving congregation in Davao City, Philippines.

In June, we were contacted by a man in Obwoni, Kenya, who, along with a denominational group, had been converted through watching GBN. We provided funds for faithful brethren to visit the area, confirm their understanding, and help establish the new congregation. While there, more souls were baptized—and in October, we learned of even more additions to the Lord's body in Obwoni.

Just this past week, I preached in Huntsville, Alabama. At the conclusion of the lesson, a gentleman came forward who had a trach tube inserted in his neck. He could not speak, and his doctors had warned him not to be immersed in water. Yet he was determined to obey the gospel. Upon his insistence, the insert was removed and covered with duct tape, and Jeff Campbell was baptized for the remission of his sins. I have often heard of hypothetical examples of people who “could not” be baptized—but Jeff refused to let that stop him.

I could fill several pages with similar accounts: Sergio, baptized at age 84; Dalton Rone, who became a Christian after watching the GBN app for 20 hours straight; Sam and Lori, devoted Calvinists for over 50 years who finally obeyed the gospel; Logan, baptized in a horse trough in his backyard in Wisconsin; Nessya, who studied with us via Zoom; Courtney Brooks and her husband, who reached out after seeing GBN on social media; and many others—Keith Queen, Miller McMurry, Rex Albritton, Jeff Evans, and countless more whose names we may not know until we meet them in heaven.

We are thrilled and deeply honored to play a role in sharing the gospel with so many who are now our brothers and sisters in Christ. Thank you for helping make these resources available.

However, consider this sobering truth: two people die every second worldwide—about 120 souls pass into eternity every minute, most having never obeyed the gospel. Billions of people on this earth have yet to hear the saving truth. It is GBN's goal to change that.

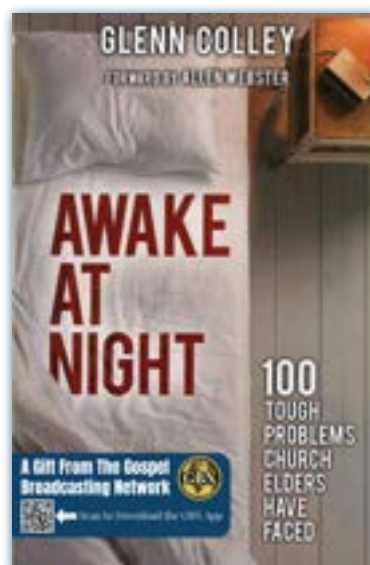
